Crown Castle's business model is built around long-term investment—we intend to be the last owner of our assets. We recognize the value our infrastructure creates for communities and our responsibility to reduce environmental impact. We are invested in the communities we serve and are committed to deploying our communications infrastructure responsibly, building and maintaining solutions that deliver long-term value. We strive to integrate environmental considerations into our planning and decision-making process with the goal of promoting sound environmental practices internally and externally.

We are dedicated to conducting our business with integrity and have developed this Environmental Sustainability Policy ("Policy") with guidance from the principles of recognized international standards and voluntary initiatives, including, but not limited to:

- The UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)
- The Paris Agreement
- The Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact
- Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) Standards
- Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosure (TCFD) Recommendations
- Sustainability Accounting Standards Board (SASB) Standards
- Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) global disclosure system

Our environmental management system, based on ISO 14001, provides a mechanism to help us understand our environmental footprint and manage our legal and regulatory compliance obligations. Crown Castle is committed to operating in compliance with all applicable environmental laws and regulations and expects suppliers to do the same.

Crown Castle aims to disclose relevant environmental factors in a timely and transparent manner. Consistent with our commitment to align with environmental best practices, Crown Castle reports annually to CDP, TCFD, GRI and SASB, and discloses results and goals in our Sustainability report and on our website.

The principles outlined in this Policy align with our Proper Business Practices and Ethics Policy, our Supplier Code of Conduct and other applicable policies.

As used in this Policy, the terms "Crown Castle," "we," "our company" and "our" refer to Crown Castle Inc. and its subsidiaries. References to "employees" refer to all Crown Castle personnel, whether full-time, part-time or temporary. All employees are responsible for reading, understanding and complying with company policies and exercising good judgement.

Applicability

This Policy applies to all Crown Castle employees. In addition to the expectations outlined in the Supplier Code, we expect entities providing products, people or services to Crown Castle ("Suppliers"), including their subcontractors and agents, to abide by the principles in this Policy in their work with Crown Castle and in their broader operations.

Environmental Oversight

Crown Castle's Board of Directors ("Board"), including through its committees, oversees climate-related risks as part of its broader annual enterprise risk assessment. The risk assessment occurs throughout the year during regularly scheduled meetings of the Board and its committees. Consistent with the authority delegated to it under its Charter, the Nominating and Governance Committee assists the Board in overseeing the Company's environmental strategy, goals, initiatives and related policies, while senior management is responsible for the day-to-day execution of this Environmental Sustainability Policy and for providing regular updates to the Committee on performance, risks and progress.

Environmental Sustainability Policy

Senior management proactively assesses and manages climate-related risks and opportunities. Crown Castle's Vice President Corporate Finance and Treasurer, together with the Director of Sustainability and Assistant Treasurer coordinate company-wide sustainability priorities and keep senior management apprised of climate-related initiatives and opportunities identified through engagement with business teams, shareholders, the investment community and benchmarking analyses.

Every three to five years, senior management performs a Sustainability Materiality Assessment, which evaluates the significance of key topics across sustainability and operational categories. This process helps determine their relevance to Crown Castle's long-term resilience and value-creation based on their importance to the company's business success and to stakeholders. It also serves as a valuable opportunity to engage with internal and external stakeholders, including shareholders, customers, employees, communities and regulators.

Environmentally Responsible Management

Crown Castle is committed to integrating environmental responsibility into all aspects of its operations. Consistent with this commitment, it is our policy to conduct business in a manner that safeguards the environment, protects public health and promotes the well-being of our employees and the ecosystems in which we operate.

In addition to complying with all applicable environmental laws and regulations, we strive to:

- A. Make environmental concerns an integral part of our planning and decision-making process.
- B. Promote and practice sound environmental stewardship of all company facilities and properties.
- C. Proactively reduce resource use, waste and environmental impact, including greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, associated with our assets and operations.
- D. Identify opportunities to enhance environmental standards in our office leases, including promoting green building certifications, ensuring adequate recycling facilities and incorporating Energy-Star or equivalent appliances and fixtures into architectural design standards.
- E. Educate employees on environmental stewardship and encourage innovative approaches to improving the environmental aspects of our operations.
- F. Avoid, minimize and mitigate adverse environmental impacts caused by our operations where possible.
- G. Collaborate with government agencies and others in framing responsible laws, regulations and standards affecting the community, workplace and environment.
- H. Continually improve our environmental programs.
- I. Implement practices that promote biodiversity and land stewardship, including avian protection, wildlife awareness and habitat conservation.
- J. Evaluate our environmental performance through periodic reviews and audits to ensure alignment with these principles.
